

Juvenile Crimes



Juveniles or minors under the age of eighteen years of age may be prosecuted the same as adults.

If Juvenile offenders make their own decisions to plead guilty or who are found guilty of crimes under New Jersey law, they have a good chance of facing criminal prosecution. A judge may also be hearing the evidence and render a verdict, in some cases.
